

ELEMENTS OF SEA LORE THE INTERNATIONAL FLAG CODE

As the largest moving objects made by man, ships are subject to stringent international regulations. When circumstances are in doubt or shipping lanes crowded, ships will often use their whistles to show which way they will turn, much as a car driver uses his directional signals. One blast on the whistle means she is turning to starboard. Two blasts mean a turn to port. The other vessel will acknowledge by repeating the same signal. Ships also carry navigational running lights: green for starboard, and red for port. In addition, two white lights are carried on the mast, the forward one positioned lower than the aft.

Flags and pennants form another significant part of the ship's communication facilities and are displayed for identification purposes. Every time a country is visited, its national flag is shown as a courtesy. While entering and leaving a port, the ship flies a blue and yellow flag with vertical stripes to request a pilot, while half red, half white (divided

vertically) indicates that a pilot is on board. Cruise lines and passenger shipping lines also display their own 'house' flag, proudly fluttering from the main mast.

Flags of the international flag code are used at sea and can be translated into 9 languages. The set of flags toward the port-side wing of the Bridge are each given a letter to identify meanings, and are stored in alphabetical order; however, it is their colours, which are important. Flags are flown so that vessels can identify one another and states of maneuvering they may be in.

One of the most commonly signals used is 'B' for bunkering for instance. Specific flags can also be used to convey a warning or distress message: 'O' for man overboard, 'D' for steering difficulties and so on.
